## Chapter Sixteen — *Love Never Ends* (1 Corinthians 13:8)

“Love never ends.” — 1 Corinthians 13:8

### Big Idea

Love outlasts everything else because it is rooted in the eternal nature of God.

After fifteen descriptions of what love is (and is not), Paul closes with a breathtaking truth: **love never ends**. Everything else in this world is temporary—possessions, achievements, even certain spiritual gifts—but love will remain forever.

Spiritual gifts serve a purpose for this present age, but they will one day fade away. Love, however, carries on into eternity. Faith will become sight. Hope will be fulfilled. But love will continue—unchanged and undiminished.

This is because love flows directly from God Himself. God is love, and God is eternal. His love does not wear out, break down, or become obsolete. It sustains us now and will surround us forever in His presence.

Knowing that love never ends reshapes our priorities. It invites us to invest in what lasts—relationships, compassion, faithfulness, and service motivated by love. Every act of love becomes an eternal investment.

One day, in Christ’s presence, love will be perfected. No fear. No misunderstanding. No failure. Only uninterrupted love forever. That future gives meaning to every loving choice we make today.
