Question

Acts 2:42 *“So continuing daily with **one accord** in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, they ate their food with gladness and simplicity of heart,”*

Be in one accord in the details

- We can sing different parts but the same song
- We have different gifts, abilities, and ministries but we strive for the same purpose, and person
- One note out of line makes the whole chord sound Bad!
- A good sound is instantly recognized and attractive.

Definition:

"A unique Greek word, used 10 of its 12 New Testament occurrences in the Book of Acts, helps us understand the uniqueness of the Christian community. *Homothumadon* is a compound of two words meaning to "rush along" and "in unison." The image is almost musical; a number of notes are sounded which, while different, harmonize in pitch and tone. As the instruments of a great concert under the direction of a concert master, so the Holy Spirit blends together the lives of the members of Christ's church."
